### **VA Fiscal Year 2024 Accomplishments**

**88,306** formerly homeless Veterans are now under lease through the Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program, the most in the history of the program

**42,064** unsheltered Veterans have been engaged through outreach efforts

**13,110+** new employment instances produced for Veterans who engaged in or exited from VA homeless programs or services

**83,715** Veterans and their families have been permanently housed or prevented from becoming homeless, the most since FY 2019

**149,638** Veterans and their family members served by Supportive Services for Veteran Families, the most ever served by the program in a single year

**96%** of Veterans housed in 2024 remained in housing at the end of the year

**10,500+** Veterans moved to permanent housing after exiting the Grant and Per Diem program

**261+** homeless Veteran Stand Down events hosted and attended by more than 48,680 Veterans

**47,925** Veterans permanently housed as part of VA's FY 2024 Homelessness Goals

**50,000+** justice-involved Veterans served through Veterans Justice Outreach and Health Care for Reentry Veterans, helping them stay connected and engaged with care

**22,300** Veterans served by Homeless Patient Aligned Care Teams (HPACTs), receiving health care and supportive services in the community from 25 mobile medical units deployed across the country
